The Clean Energy Group's Clean Air Policy Initiative opposes S.J. Res. 37

The Clean Energy Group's Clean Air Policy Initiative does not support the use of the Congressional Review Act resolution of disapproval, S.J. Res. 37, to block implementation of EPA's final Mercury and Air Toxics Standards (MATS) for power plants. Since 2000, the electric industry has been anticipating that EPA would regulate hazardous air pollutant emissions, and the MATS rule is consistent with the requirements of the Clean Air Act. S.J. Res. 37 would prevent EPA from implementing these standards and in doing so, create significant business uncertainty, undermining the investments already made and the planning underway by many in the electric sector to date.
