As a Fine Art and Commercial Photographer, it is difficult enough to make a living in this economy since 9/11 without having to spend valuable time researching and tracking down my images stolen from my website and publications. Which now appear without credit or copyright on Google.

2 of my photographs in particular are featured over and over again on different sites- and I've had little or no recourse getting them taken down. Google is just about impossible to communicate with, an endless loop of useless prompts and complaint mail to their address is returned to sender.

It is very discouraging that creativity is of so little monetary value in this country- yet it can be stolen and used repeatedly on the internet if it's free.

Please help us to monitor and protect out creations and livelihood with Copyright protection enforcement.
