Dear Mr. Speaker:

Section 251(a)(7) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended, requires that the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) submit a report to the Congress on discretionary appropriations legislation within seven calendar days of enactment (excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays). The report must contain the OMB and Congressional Budget Office estimates of discretionary new budget authority and outlays provided by the legislation and an explanation of any differences between the two estimates.

Enclosed is the report for the Consolidated and Further Continuing Appropriations Act, 2015 ("the Act"; Public Law 113-235). The President signed the Act into law on December 16, 2014. The report includes separate tables on each of the following eleven appropriations bills contained in the Act:

- 1. Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2015 (Division A) Table 1, page 1;

CBO uses the same subsidy rate as OMB, so the entire difference is due to CBO's lower estimate of volume (\$275 billion compared to OMB's estimate of \$297 billion). Both CBO and OMB score the spending of multiclass fees at \$23 million, a reduction of \$5 million from the Request level. However, CBO scores -\$94 million in offsetting collections from Commitment and Multiclass fees collected pursuant to title III of the National Housing Act and OMB scores -\$89 million. OMB's lower estimate of fees reflects a \$5 million reduction in collections because of the commensurate decrease in the spending level from the Request. CBO also scores \$1 million in contingent administrative expenses, whereas OMB does not assume that the contingency provision is triggered. On net, this results in a -\$58 million difference in budget authority and outlays from new authority.
