Statement from OMB Director Shaun Donovan:

**Budgetary Impact Analysis for Executive Order Entitled  
“National Security Medal”**

This executive order amends Executive Order 10431, which established the National Security Medal. Implementing this executive order is anticipated to have a de minimis impact on costs and no impact on revenues to the Federal Government. The benefits of the executive order include expanding the categories of individuals eligible to receive the National Security Medal for their meritorious contributions to the national security as a whole, rather than, as is now the case, limiting the award to solely achievements in the field of intelligence. Implementing this executive order is anticipated to have a de minimis impact on mandatory and discretionary obligations and outlays, and no impact on revenues to the Federal Government, in the 5-fiscal year period beginning in fiscal year 2015. The agencies anticipated to be impacted by this executive order is the Executive Office of the President and the Office of the Director of National Intelligence.
