

(billions of pounds)



FDA Seafood Border Inspectors





(percentage of shipments)





Share of U.S. Seafood Consumption



Imported Aquaculture Uses Illegal Veterinary Medicines/Antifungals

- Density of fish – crowding leads to disease
- Quality of water
- Weak environmental enforcement
- Lower or unenforced rules on antibiotics/antifungals
- Majority of production small scale, rural, apply chemicals without knowledge, training


Chemicals Tested for by FDA

Chemical	Year FDA Started Testing	Human Health Hazards	Common Aquaculture Fish
Chloramphenicol (AB)	2002	Aplastic anemia, potential carcinogen, antibiotic resistance	Shrimp, crab, crayfish
Nitrofurans (AB)	2004	Potential carcinogen, antibiotic resistance	Shrimp
Quinolones (AB)	2003/2004	Antibiotic resistance	Catfish, salmon, shrimp, tilapia
Malachite Green (AF)	2005	Potential carcinogen	Catfish, eel, salmon
Gentian Violet (AF)	2006	Potential carcinogen	Catfish, eel, salmon




Asian Catfish Imports by Country



Asian Catfish Imports by Country










