Silica and the Boiler Slags are close in cutting. Glass is the next best granule that would be price friendly. The problem with the glass is if the coatings are a little tough it does not work. Most of the bridges, Water Towers, and Lock and Dams fall in this category. All the other abrasives such as Star Blast, Steel Grit, are to costly, Copper and Nickel Slag are said to have a heavy metal problem.
